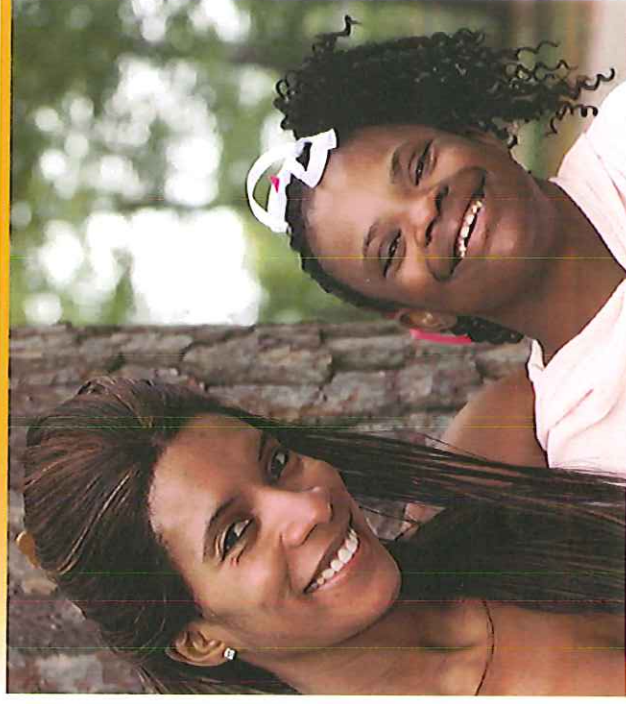

ASPIRE Intellectual / Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) Program at Northeast Guidance Center provides specialized services and supports in a recovery-enhanced environment to children, adolescents and adults with an intellectual, developmental and/or physical disability.

Examples of conditions, or combination of conditions, which may qualify a person for ASPIRE services are Autism, Asperger's Syndrome, Pervasive Developmental Disability, Cognitive Impairment, or physical disabilities such as Cerebral Palsy (CP), Muscular Dystrophy and Spina Bifida.



Onset must be before age 22 years and result in a disability that is likely lifelong. A full array of medically necessary services are available including, but not limited to:

FAQ

1. What if my child has ADHD or another diagnosis? How will services be arranged if my child is eligible for ASPIRE?

Aspire I/DD provides comprehensive services for children and adolescents who may have co-occurring disorders, such as ADHD or another emotional diagnosis, and a developmental disability.

2. What if an adult also has a serious mental illness, or substance abuse along with a developmental disability?

For adolescents and adults whose co-occurring disorders may include serious mental illness, or substance abuse along with a developmental disorder, the ASPIRE I/DD program can coordinate services to meet your needs.

3. My child is already receiving mental health services at Northeast Guidance Center, or another provider. I think my child has a developmental disability, but I do not want to have a gap in services. What do I do?

Talk to your therapist who can assist you in the process. For other providers, contact the ACCESS department of Northeast Guidance Center (**877-242-4140**) and explain that you would like your child to be assessed as a person with a developmental disability. An appointment will be provided, and you and your child will receive a thorough assessment by a trained professional. Bring any test reports or other paperwork you may have. Additional documentation may be requested. Your child will continue to receive services during the assessment and transfer process. It will be seamless to you!

The same process is true for adults!
